ICOM urges and encourages local authorities and civil society to pursue their efforts in protecting and safeguarding the invaluable cultural heritage of this country.

It is essential to protect the exceptionally rich collections of the Egyptian museums so that they may continue to enrich the collective

memory of mankind. The international museum community is fully aware of the significant efforts already made by the country's heritage authorities to preserve these collections, and ICOM wishes to encourage those authorities to take further precautions to protect the country's overall heritage, and in particular that of museums.
