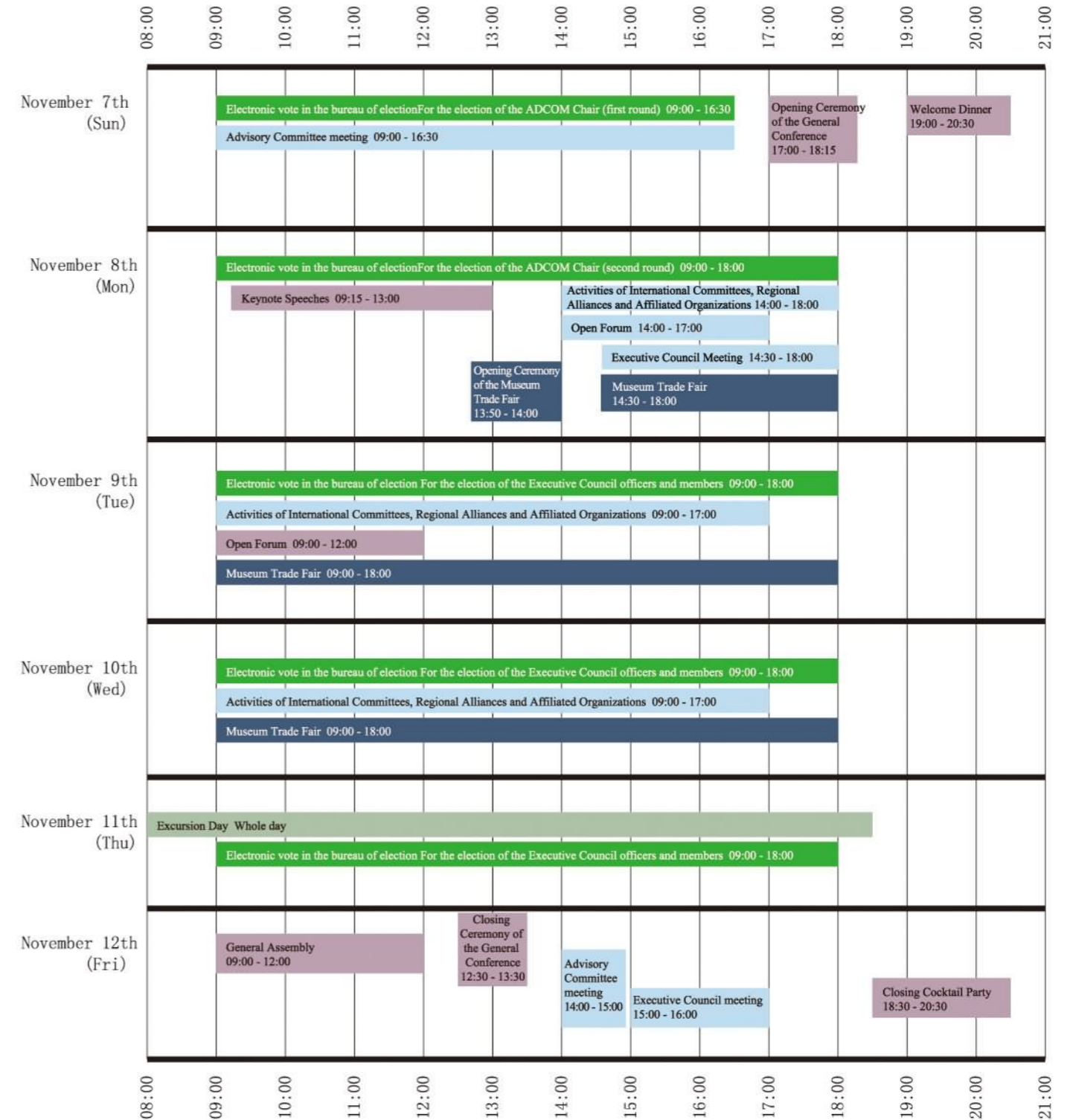
ICOM 2010 will address urgent concerns for protecting and safeguarding of all forms of heritage, especially in countries and regions where heritage

Keynote Speakers



Alpha • Oumar • Konaré
The Increasing Enrichment of Museology

Alpha • Oumar • Konaré, former President of ICOM, is a Malian politician and a man of culture. He successively served as Head of the Heritage Department and as Minister of Culture of Mali. He also chaired the West African Archaeology Association. President of ICOM and Vice President of ICOMOS, he also served as an expert for the UNESCO, the African Cultural Institute and ACCT. In politics, he was President of Mali for two five-year terms (1992-2002), and Chairperson of the African Union Commission (2003-2008). His presidential terms are noted for the restoration of democracy in spite of the difficult organisation of the 1997 general elections, his management of the Tuareg rebellion in the north, and devolution. On the international stage, he has worked for peace in Africa and regional integration.



Gabriella • Battaini • Dragoni
Europe, Museums And Intercultural Action

Gabriella • Battaini • Dragoni is the Council of Europe's Director General of Education, Culture and Heritage, Youth and Sport. Since 2005, Mrs. Battaini-Dragoni is the Council of Europe's Coordinator for Intercultural Dialogue. In this capacity, she has been responsible for the preparation of the Council of Europe White Paper on Intercultural Dialogue, adopted on 7 May 2008 at ministerial level, the first document of its kind at international level, and the Council of Europe 'Speak out against Discrimination' campaign. Mrs. Battaini-Dragoni is a frequently invited guest speaker at UN, OECD, OSCE, and EU meetings.



Lourdes • Arizpe
Memory, Reverence and Innovation: which museums?

Lourdes • Arizpe (Mexico) is Professor at the National University of Mexico and member of the Order of Academics Palms in France. She was Director of the National Museum of Popular Cultures, President of the International Social Science Council and Assistant Director-General for Culture at UNESCO. Member of the United Nations Commission on Culture and Development, she also coordinated the Intergovernmental Conference on Cultural Policy for Development. She received an Honorary Doctorate from University of Florida. Prof. Arizpe has published 12 books and many articles on indigenous communities, women and development, and culture and global change. Her most recent publication is *Intangible Cultural Heritage of Mexico: Rites and Festivities* (2009).

Keynote Speakers



Fan Jinshi
Preservation and Utilisation of Cultural Relics and Exploration of Harmonious Development

Fan Jinshi graduated from the Department of History, Beijing University in 1963 with a major in archaeology. Having worked for Dunhuang Academy since 1963, she is now curator and researcher of the Dunhuang Academy and researcher of the Central Research Institute of Culture and History, and was elected member of the 8th, 9th, 10th and 11th CPPCC. Her research focuses on grotto preservation and management as well as grotto archaeology. She has presided and participated in the reinforcement project of Yulin grotto as well as multiple projects including the Study on the Environmental Evolution and Grotto Preservation of Dunhuang Mogao Grottos, Study on the Visitor Bearing Capacity and Opening Policies of Mogao Grottos, the Preservation and Valorisation of Dunhuang Grottos and the Overall Planning for the Preservation of Dunhuang Mogao Grottos (2006 - 2025); she wrote and compiled monographs including *Categorized Collection of Chinese Fine Arts*, *Collection of Chinese Frescoes*, *Dunhuang 3*, *Northern Zhou Dynasty*, *Dunhuang Grotto Collection - Buddhist Legends*, and presided the compilation of the 26 volumes of *Dunhuang Grotto Collection (Special Categorized Collection)*, 10 volumes of *Dunhuang Grotto*, *Dunhuang, China and Dunhuang - The Real and the Virtual*. She also published several papers, including *Dunhuang Mogao Grottos (Northern Dynasties)*, *Mogao Grottos (Sui Dynasty)*, *Dunhuang Mogao Grottos (Early Tang Dynasty)* and *An Exploration of the Stability of Rock Mass of Mogao Grottos on the Basis of Historical Relics in Mogao Grottoes*.



Okwui • Enwezor
Off-Centred: Modernity and Postcolonial Ambivalence

Okwui • Enwezor is a curator, writer and scholar. He is the founding publisher and editor of *NKA: Journal of Contemporary African Art*. Since 2005, he is Assistant Curator at the International Center of Photography, New York and was previously Assistant Curator of Contemporary Art, at the Art Institute of Chicago. Mr. Enwezor has served as the Artistic Director of several leading biennials and global exhibitions. His extensive curatorial credits include exhibitions presented in museums and venues across the United States, Europe, Asia, Africa and Latin America. He is currently completing work on two historical exhibitions as part of a trilogy of exhibitions focusing on the African continent at the International Center of Photography, New York.



Chen Xiejun
Museum Management "Committed to Social Harmony"

Chen Xiejun, follows doctoral courses in the Department of Philosophy, Washington University in St. Louis. His current titles include: Vice Chairperson of the Chinese National Committee of ICOM, Vice Chairperson of the Organizing Committee of the 22th General Assembly of ICOM, Vice Chairperson of the Chinese Association of Museums, Vice Director of the Shanghai Municipal Administration Commission for Cultural Heritage, Head Curator and researcher of Shanghai Museum, doctoral adviser, member of the Executive Board of the ASEF Museum Association, member of the International Council of the Asian Society, and General Director of the Shanghai Committee of Cultural Heritage and Museums. He is also the advisor and General Planner of the Theme Development of the 2010 Shanghai World Expo. His research mainly focuses on philosophic theories, scientific philosophy, macroscopic theories of contemporary urban culture and new subjects, library science and museum science. He has developed philosophical theories dealing with the science of time (in cooperation with Jin Zhe), the science of space and the science of the subject, and published over 70 books, including *Introduction to the Science of the Subject - Theoretical Exploration of Subject Development*, *The Science of Time and Chromatics in Life*, and over 1,000 papers and articles. He also receives the governmental special allowance granted by the State Council.

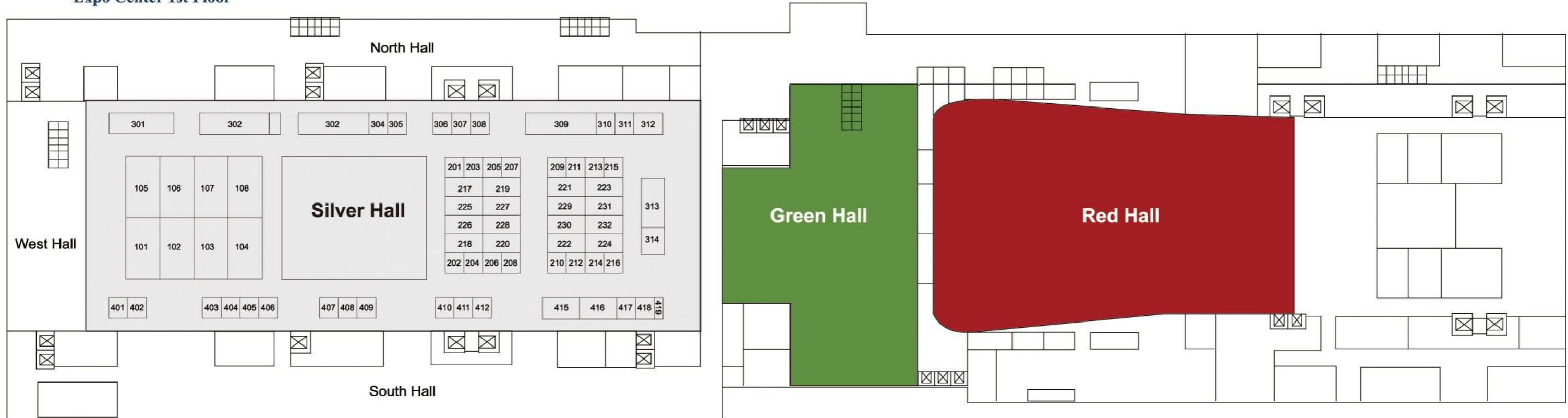

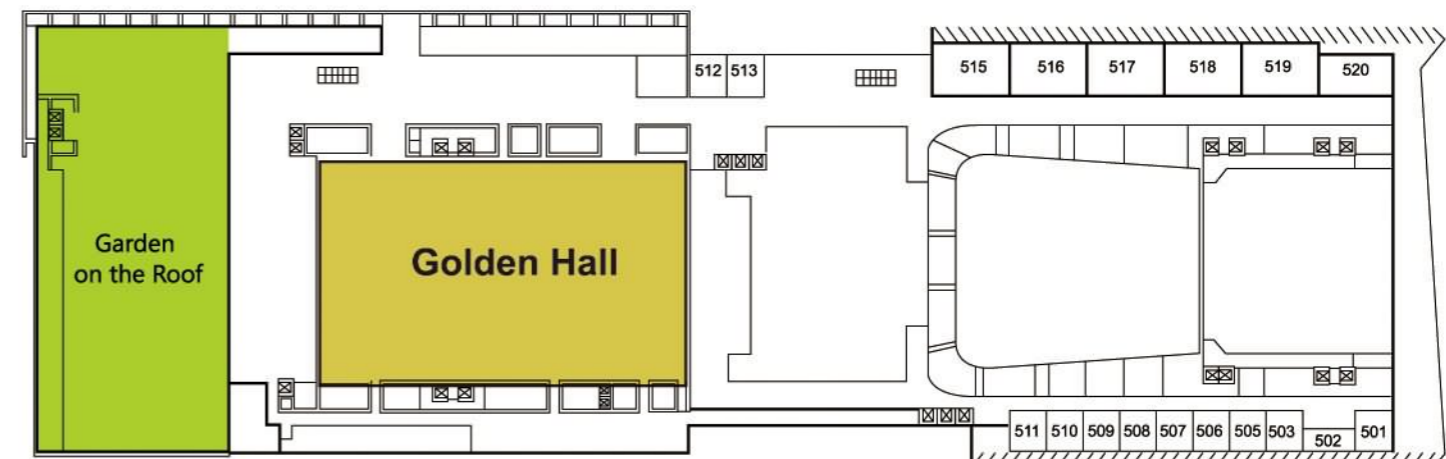

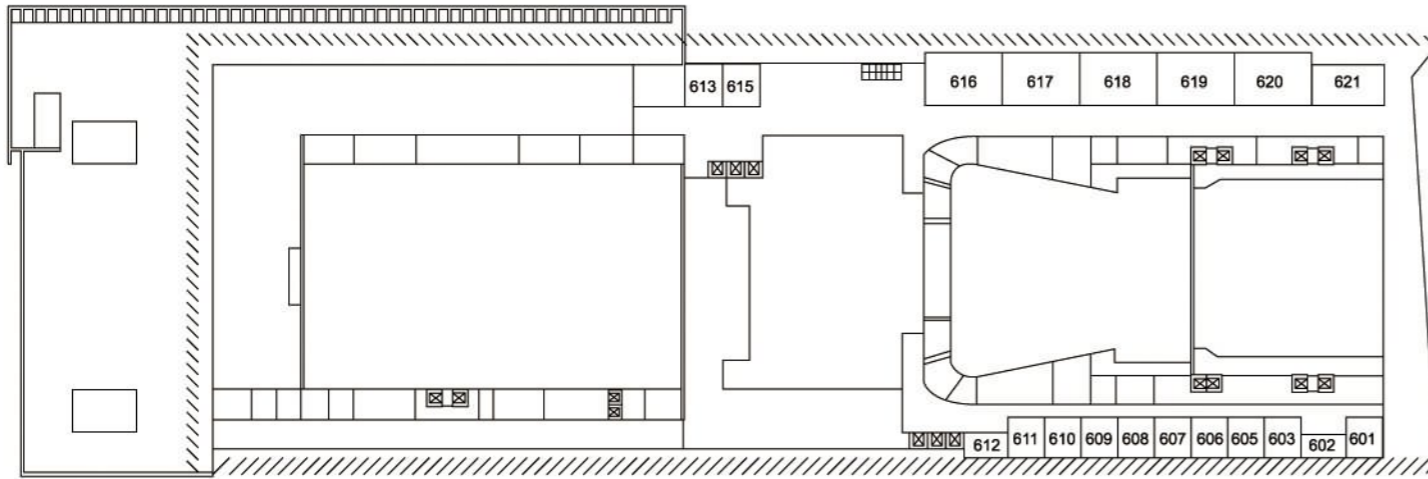

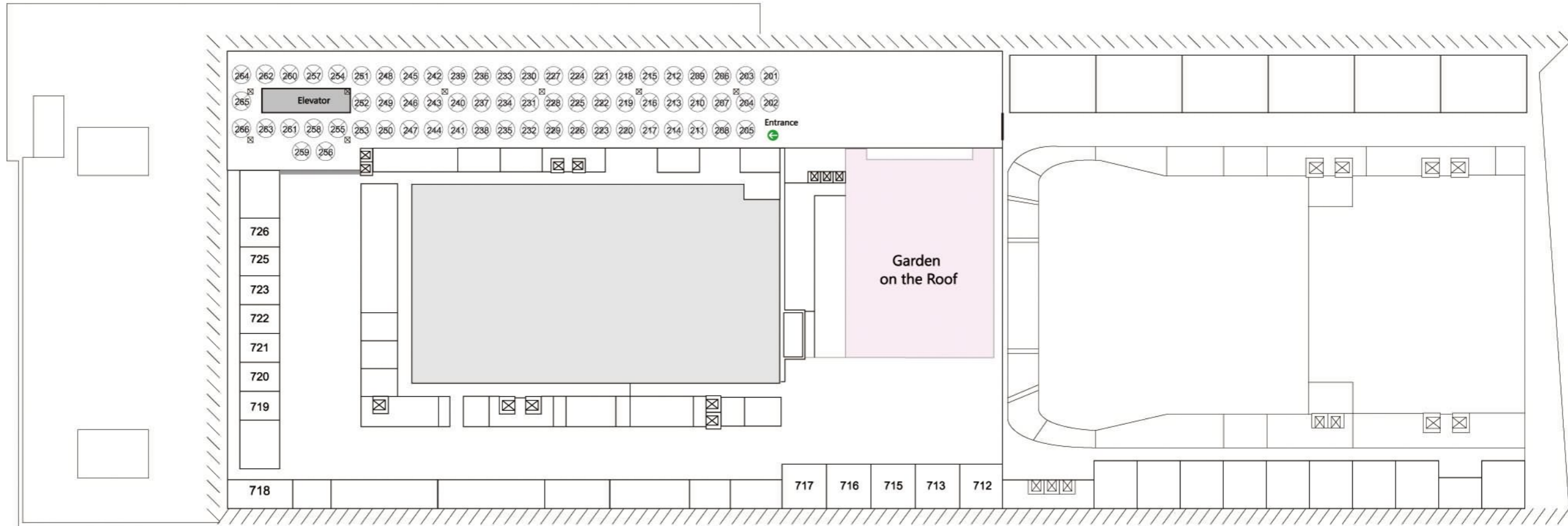

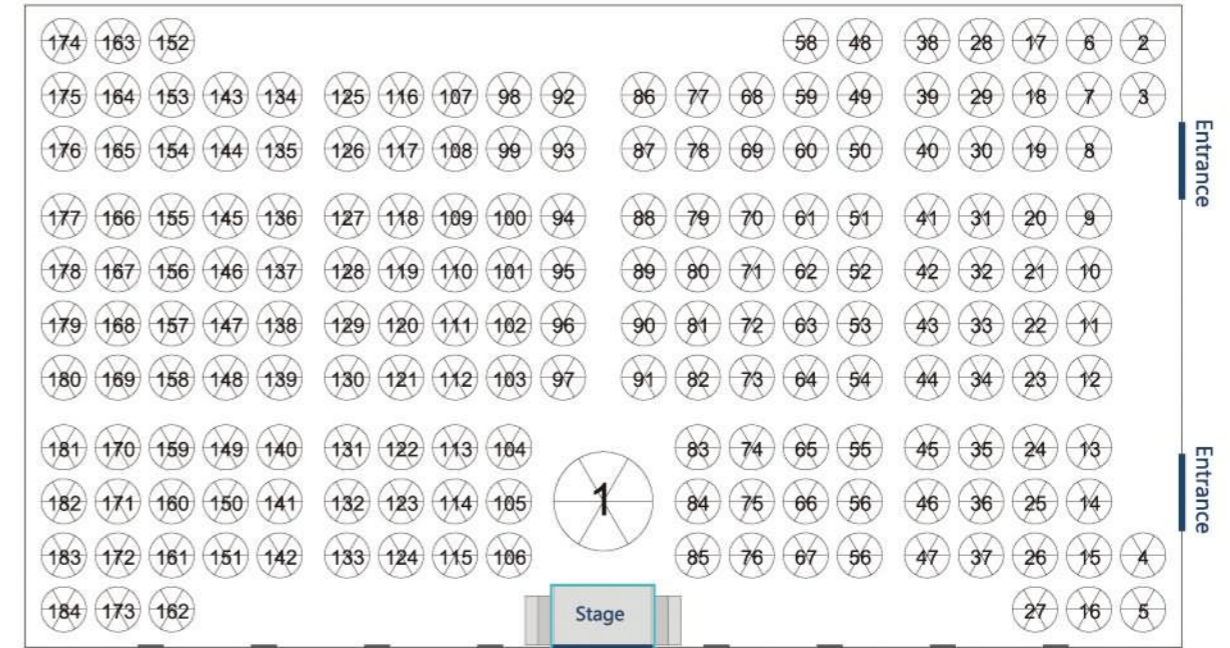

Brief Notes

Passport

please make at least one copy of your passport, so that we can ensure your check-in to the hotel in advance, which will save time.

Please keep your passport in a safe place.

Money

Chinese currency is called Renminbi (RMB) of which the literal translation would be "The People's Currency". The popular unit of RMB is "yuan" The official exchange rate between U.S. dollar and Renminbi yuan currently is about 1:667. One yuan equals to 10 jiao, and 1 jiao equals to 10 fen. In certain regions of China, the yuan is also known as kuai and jiao is known as mao. Chinese currency is issued in the following denominations: one, two, five, ten, twenty, fifty and one hundred yuan notes; one, two and five jiao notes or coins; and one, two and five fen notes or coins.

Credit Cards

Most foreign credit cards are accepted in China. We recommend you to use Visa and MasterCard, which are the most popular in China. The credit card signs are displayed in visible places in shops and hotels indicating what types of cards are accepted.

Electricity

Electricity in China runs on 220V, 50 cycles AC. Two-pin sockets and some three-pin sockets are used. Outside the bathroom, only 220V socket is provided. Make sure to bring an adapter plug.

Copies

Make copies of all important documents (passport, visas, travelers' checks, driver's license, credit cards, etc.). Carry one copy with you, leave one with your relative at home, and leave one to a travelling companion.

Health declaration card

All visitors entering China are required to complete a health declaration card that is distributed by the cabin crew during the flight to China.

Personal medical history

If you have any health problems, ask your doctor for a copy of your medical history should you need to consult a Chinese doctor. This information should include your name, address, insurance information, emergency contact, blood type, medical problems and prior hospitalizations, current medications (generic names) and dosages, drug allergies, and immunizations (with dates).

Caution

The Chinese do not have RH-negative blood, and therefore their blood banks do not store it. Also, type O blood is rare. Thus, individuals with these blood types should consult their physicians for advice before departing for China.

Prescription drugs

You may bring your prescription drugs to China. Pack them in your carry-on luggage. Be sure that medication is clearly marked with a pharmacy label and doctor's instructions. Estimate in advance what medication will be needed and bring an adequate amount for your entire trip.

Travel insurance

We recommend that all visitors to China purchase travel insurance sufficient to cover medical needs and trip curtailment beyond the coverage of the Agency policy.

Glasses and Contact Lenses: If you wear glasses or contacts, take along a copy of the prescription and an extra pair if you have one.

Customs regulations

When entering China, foreign travelers must declare articles in their luggage which are required by Chinese customs authorities on their own initiative and clear the luggage through customs.

If you have any articles that are required to be declared by customs authority, please fill out a declaration form (in two copies) and hand it in to customs, retaining a copy to show upon exit.

Brief Notes

Luggage

Unless porter service are confirmed, you will be responsible for carrying your own luggage and all your belongings when you are in the airports and hotels. For important reasons of space and safety, try to limit your baggage to several normal-sized suitcases, and carry as little luggage as possible. Make sure your bags/suitcases have your name and address (business, preferably) both inside and outside.

Meals in China

Both Chinese and Western cuisines are available. All breakfasts are western style buffet with fruits, cold and hot cereals. A Chinese meal consists of rice (or noodle, dumpling, etc.), vegetable, fish, duck, chicken, pork, beef and so on. In a meal, there are usually 8 dishes, plus a soup. It is strongly suggested that you do not take food from street vendors. For vegetarians, we provide vegetarian food, and all food served at the welcome dinner and farewell party contains no pork. Please kindly make any such request if you have any to our staff at the information desk in each hotel in advance.

Drinking water

The tap water is not drinkable in China. If your hotel room does not provide drinking water dispenser, simply dial the number of housekeeping department, and a chambermaid will be glad to bring you a thermos of hot water or a carafe of cold drinking water free of charge. Chinese and Western mineral/spring water can be purchased in most hotels.

Hotels

All hotel rooms are air-conditioned and equipped with a telephone and TV on which you can see most popular Chinese Channels, CNN, etc. In the bathroom (with shower), free toothbrush, toothpaste, comb, and towels are provided. Besides, in the 4-star hotels or above, laundry service, mini-bar and safety box are available. However, the mini-bar and laundry service are charged.

The mini-bar, Pay-TV and Telephone in your rooms would be in the off-mode. If you want to use it, please go to the reception to pay a deposit for it.

Hotel Card

Please take the hotel card with you. Show it to the taxi driver when you return the hotel.

Metro

Metro stations are easily identifiable by their red on white "M" signs. Although not always easy to spot, stations do have signage in English. Metro lines are best used for longer trips, for example, from Pudong to Puxi.

There are 13 metro lines in Shanghai now. They run from 6:00 am to midnight and trains run frequently. Ticket machines or staff at the metro station sells single-journey metro tickets costing 3-5 yuan.

Taxi

In Shanghai, taxi costs RMB 11 yuan at the starting point which covers 3 kilometers. Beyond 3 kilometers, the extra rate is RMB 2.1 yuan for 1 kilometer.

Smoking

Smoking is not allowed in certain public spaces in China. Note smoking is also strictly prohibited on domestic flights.

Shanghai Museum

In 1992, the Shanghai Municipality allocated a lot just located the very center of the city, People's Square, to the Museum for its new building. It took three years to construct the new building, from 1993 to 1996, covering a total floor space of 39,200 m2 and with a height of 29.5 m. The new building, with a spheric top contrasting a square base, carries the ancient Chinese conception of the universe, square earth covered by the round sky, and is deemed a perfect combination of tradition and contemporary taste. The new museum building now consists of eleven galleries for permanent display and three temporary exhibition halls, which extends warmest welcome to visitors from both home and abroad.

The Memorial Hall and Site of the First CPC National Congress was established in 1952. Its main building covers a land of 600 m2, with a floor space of 900 m2. The Songjiang District Museum began its construction on January 24, 1915, formerly named Songjiang County Education Books Museum. In November 2004, the new Songjiang District museum had

been renovated and was opened to the public. The basic exhibition of the new museum alters the traditional exhibit mode of local history, displaying cultural relics according to their characters. It comprises three independent sections and presents a diverse collection of archaeological findings, works of arts of Songjiang Painting School and documents, showing the different historical courses of Songjiang District.

Shanghai Astronomy Museum



The Sheshan Astronomical Observatory, located at the peak of Sheshan Hill and initiated in 1900, is one of the cradles of Chinese modern astronomy. On April 27, 2002, the Sheshan Astronomy Observatory was designated

by the People's Government of Shanghai as a major site protected for its historical and cultural value at the provincial level. In 2004, the Shanghai Astronomy Museum was founded housed in the Sheshan Astronomy Observatory. The museum is composed of two parts of exhibitions: "Time and Human Being" and "Astronomy Exchange Between China and Foreign Countries". An array of exhibits, including some astronomical instruments, cultural relics and photographs, are on display in the museum, showing the development and achievements of Chinese astronomy.

Chongming County Museum



The Chongming County Museum, founded in 1959, is located in ancient Chongming School that was designated by the People's Government of Shanghai as a major site protected for its historical and

cultural value at the provincial level on May 4, 1984. With a total exhibition space of 1,841.5 square meters, the museum is divided into several sections of exhibitions based on the natural pattern of the whole building complex. A number of exhibits and cultural relics are on display in the museum, showing the historical evolution and unique local folks of Chongming Island. In addition, the Minglun Hall is used as a temporary exhibition hall of the museum to hold various high-quality temporary exhibitions loaned from other local or domestic museums.

Climate of Shanghai

The Weather in Shanghai:

November: 20°~10° at the beginning and 15°~5° at the end of the month.

According to Shanghai Meteorological Observatory's forecast, November levels of precipitation in Shanghai will be close to those observed in the same period of past years and the average air temperature will be slightly higher than normal.

Cold air fronts are expected to increase in frequency as the month progresses, which may cause sharp declines in air temperature. Please bear in mind that such conditions increase the risk of diseases like flu, cardiovascular, and cerebrovascular diseases, so take the necessary vestimentary and hygienic precautions against the cold. Shanghai has seen insufficient rainfall and low air humidity for a certain time now; the risk of fires is thus quite high and we ask you not to neglect fire prevention.

Nanjing Road enjoys the title of "The 1st Business Street of China". With over 100 Chinese long-standing shops, every necessity of life can be found here, and the "Shang Wang" (King of Commodities), Shanghai's No. 1 Department Store, is a must-see. As people say in Shanghai: "Nanjing Road, the Paradise of Shopping, has everything from everywhere".



Huaihai Road

With many characteristic shops and franchised stores of famous brands focusing on high and medium-level goods, Huaihai Road has its own tagline: "To buy clothes, go to Huaihai Road". The shops feature graceful decoration and diversified architectural styles with both European and American styles as well as buildings inspired from the oldest cities in the world. Both the external appearance and the internal layout of the shops are alive with urban leisure and culture.



Yu Yuan Mart

Shanghai's realm of artworks and pretty commodities, from curiosities, jade articles, and jewellery to expired bottle caps and strings, everything can be found here.



Scenic Spots

Oriental Pearl TV Tower

The Oriental Pearl TV Tower is located on the bank of the Huangpu River and at the tip Lujiaz Peninsula, Pudong. Towering at 468m, it is Asia's tallest and the world's 3rd tallest tower. The modern architectural complex of Lujiazui serves as a background for the Tower, creating a pleasant counterpoint to the architectural complex on the Bund across the river, resulting in magnificent scenery fit for such an international city.



Shanghai World Financial Centre Observation Deck

Shanghai World Financial Centre is a project in which over 40 enterprises from Japan and the US have invested jointly, with Mori Building Corporation being the principal investor, and a total investment of over 105 billion Japanese Yen (over 1 billion U.S. dollars).

The Bund of Shanghai

The bund of Huangpu River from Baidu Bridge to Jinlin Road East has been called "The Bund" (in Chinese "Wai Tan", meaning the external bund, since it's beyond the old city area of the former Shanghai County). As the initial outline of the city of Shanghai, it had been called Huangpu Road, Yangtze Road and Huangputan Road before being renamed Zhongshan No. 1 Road (E) in 1945.



Shanghai Xintiandi

As an urban scenic spot with historical and cultural styles of Shanghai, Shanghai Xintiandi is a pedestrian street gathering catering industry, business, entertainment and culture of international level constructed on the basis of the old Shikumen building area.



Tianzifang

Tianzifang is a fashionable landmark, a hub for creators and artists. Reconstructed from the unique Shikumen building complex of Shanghai, it is often called "A Second Xintiandi" by people.
