The Coordinator of Heritage Protection Programmes is in charge of the following tasks, under the responsibility of the Director of Programmes and Partnerships:

Development and follow-up of projects and programmes related to the protection of cultural heritage in emergency situations and to the fight against illicit traffic in cultural goods:

- Coordinate and follow-up projects and programmes of the Department, including Red lists of cultural objects at risk and disaster risk management for museums.
- Design and develop programmes for the protection of movable cultural heritage at risk in various countries, including museum emergency preparedness and response activities, in close collaboration with the Department's team, other areas of the organisation, and partners, when appropriate.
- Write analytical notes concerning cultural property protection and its legal and normative aspects.
- Manage administrative and budgetary aspects: drawing up budgets, monitoring expenses, contracts and agreements.
- Organise project launches and promotion, in collaboration with colleagues in Communications.
- Present the work of ICOM in the field of heritage protection at diverse capacity building seminars, conferences and other relevant national and international events.
- Draft memos, articles and reports for internal and external circulation.
